

# University of Windsor Entrance Scholarships & Awards 2010/2011

The University of Windsor provides an array of awards and financial aid programs which encourage and recognize academic achievement and help support students with financial difficulties. No matter which program you choose, you will automatically be considered for University entrance scholarships if you are coming directly from high school (*excluding Visa students from foreign high schools - see scholarships for International students*). We will review your grades in May (final and interim) to determine your eligibility for scholarships on the basis of your best six U or M level grades (or equivalent) and will forward a letter to you at that time. There will be no further review based on later grades.

## **AUTOMATIC ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

The following list outlines the entrance scholarships for which you will be considered based on your grades, as noted above:

### **Average:**

To be considered for an Outstanding Scholars Award (OUTS), candidates must be entering **directly from high school in the Fall semester** into one of the following Honours programs: Classics, French, Labour Studies (4-year combined honours program), Modern Languages, Music, Philosophy, Women's Studies, Engineering, Chemistry (not Biochemistry), Computer Science (not Business & Computer Science), Economics (not Business & Economics), Environmental Geoscience, Environmental Science, Geology, Mathematics, Mathematics and Statistics, Medical Physics, Physical Geography, Physics & High Technology, Bachelor of Arts and Science, or Environmental Studies.

Please Note: Those choosing to take a combined honours program in two OUTS eligible programs must select and maintain one of these programs for Award purposes.

During their first year of studies, OUTS students are mentored in preparation for Outstanding Scholars Appointments (valued at \$2,000) in second, third, and fourth year (provided OUTS program eligibility is maintained). ## **COMPETITION ENTRANCE AWARDS**

Listed below are some of the other awards that you may wish to compete for. Details of these can be found on our Awards search on the Student Information System. The deadline to apply for most of these awards is **APRIL 15**,

**The Ron W. Ianni Entrance Scholarship** - Four awards valued up to \$20,800 (\$5200 x 4 years) will be offered to students with a minimum 95% scholarship average, financial need, and a strong commitment to school and community activities.

**Bill Eansor Award** - One award valued at up to \$5000 (\$1250 x 4 years) available to students with a minimum scholarship average of 80% and who have demonstrated community/school involvement. Preference is given to sons and daughters of Assumption or University of Windsor Alumni. An average of 8.5 is required for renewal of this award.

**Frank J. Ewasyshyn Electrical Engineering Awards** - One annual award to Canadian Citizens/Permanent Residents residing in Ontario who are entering Electrical Engineering with at least a 75 percent scholarship average and demonstrated financial need. Established in 2000 by friends and colleagues, in honour of Frank J. Ewasyshyn.

**The Chancellor Jackman Scholarship** - Up to three Scholarships, of up to \$20,000 (\$5,000x4 years), are available to Canadian or Permanent Resident students meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements entering a program in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences directly from an Ontario High School. Students must have a minimum scholarship average of 90% and demonstrate financial need.

**The Odette Family Entrance Awards in Business Administration** - Ten awards valued up to \$4000 each are available to students entering Business with a minimum average of 80% and financial need.

**Agnes Ireland Award** - Up to three awards of at least \$2000 each awarded annually to outstanding graduates of J.L. Forster Collegiate Institute in Windsor, who have demonstrated financial need. Established in 1998 through the benefaction of Agnes M. Ireland. Applications available from J.L. Forster Collegiate Institute.

**Shaughnessy Cohen Memorial Award** - One award valued up to \$6000 is available to a Canadian or Permanent Resident student residing in Ontario who is entering a program in the Faculty of Arts or Social Science directly from an Ontario High School. Students must have a minimum scholarship average of 85%, and demonstrate financial need.

**Yves Landry Memorial Scholarships** - Up to eight awards valued at \$5000 and \$2000 are available to students entering either Business or Engineering with a minimum scholarship average of 85%, financial need and proven leadership qualities.

**Community Scholars Awards** - Up to 275 awards of \$1000 each are available to students with scholarship averages of at least 75%, and a strong commitment to school and community activities.

**University of Windsor Women in Engineering Scholarship**- Up to 50 \$1000 awards are available to women entering the Engineering program.

**Deans of Social Science Entrance Award** - Two awards valued up to \$900 each are awarded to students entering a Social Science program with a scholarship average of at least 80%.

**Graybiel Scholarship** - Six awards valued up to \$1000 each are awarded to graduates of Windsor secondary schools with a minimum scholarship average of 80% and financial need. Preference is given to the applicants entering English, French, Modern Languages, Social Science and Engineering programs. Candidates must be Canadian citizen or Permanent resident.

**Competition Awards** - Awards of \$1000 are offered in various disciplines and are based on academic standing and submission of essays, tests results, auditions or portfolio review. Specific details are sent from the academic areas which offer these awards.

**Marie Gott Bursaries for Students at General Amherst & Villanova High Schools** - Valued up to \$3000. Several bursaries awarded to students of General Amherst and Villanova High Schools. Based on good academic performance and proven financial need. Candidates must be Canadian citizens or permanent residents, residing in Ontario. Awards may be renewed for an additional three years provided all criteria are met. Application forms available in Student Awards Office and Guidance Offices at General Amherst and Villanova High Schools.

#### **Brian Keith Briggs Memorial Entrance Scholarship**

Value: up to \$2600. Offered annually to the applicant who, during his or her secondary school program, has shown the best balance among academic, athletic, and social leadership, provided that he or she has participated in some organized sports in the Town of LaSalle. Applications available in the appropriate high school. Deadline: June 15

#### **Clancy Fisher Award**

One award, valued at \$1300 (approx), made annually to a graduate of W.F. Herman Secondary School entering the University of Windsor. Applicants must have at least 70% graduation average; leadership in school activities will also be considered. Apply through the Guidance Department, W.F. Herman Secondary School.

#### **\$1000 Physics and High Technology Entrance Scholarship**

Up to 6 awards valued at \$1,000 each annually to students entering the Physics and High Technology program in the Department of Physics. Candidates must have at least 85% standing in their Mathematics and Science OAC average, or equivalent if student is from another province or is an international student. Automatic - no application process.

**Entrance Bursaries** - \$1000 bursaries are available to entering students who have demonstrated financial need.

### **IN-COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS**

The University of Windsor also offers a variety of programs which recognize academic achievement and provide support for students in financial need during their subsequent years of study through In-Course Scholarships and Awards. These programs include:

**Windsor Work Study Plan** - This program provides on-campus, part-time employment to students with financial need. Great work experience in a supportive environment are added benefits.

**General Bursary Assistance** - Students with financial need are invited to apply for consideration.
