Health care workers in this province had their wages frozen at a time when Ontario was experiencing difficult financial years. 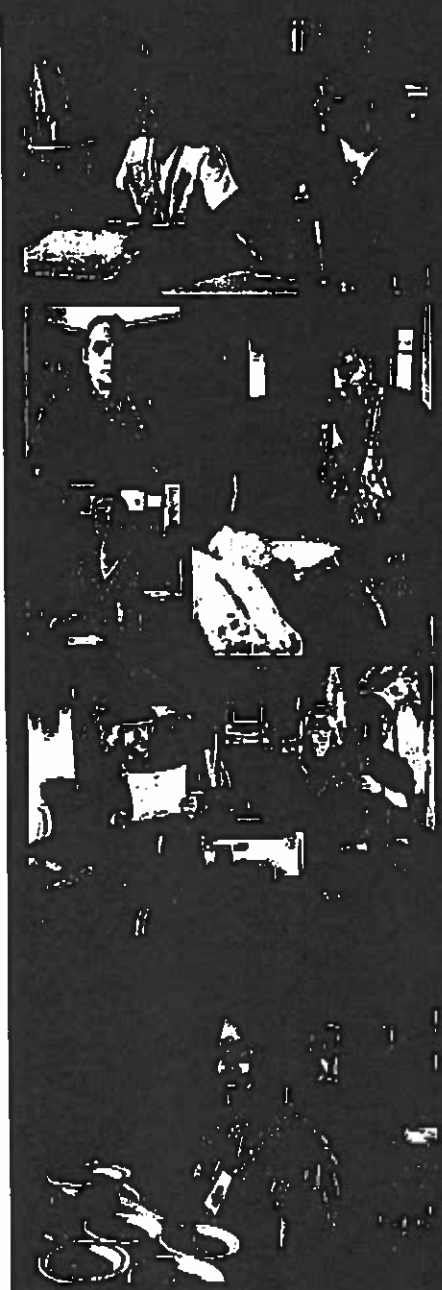
