

LEAP ESSAY CONTEST

This award offers \$1000 for the best paper on any issue to be addressed at the Law Enforcement Accountability Project 2011 Conference. This contest is open to all Canadian law students. The paper should be no longer than 30 pages (exclusive of footnotes).

TOPICS FOR SUBMISSION

The subject of entries must be on a panel topic featured at the 2011 LEAP Conference.

Entries will be judged on the quality of legal analysis, originality, depth of research, timeliness, creativity, and format. The LEAP Academic Director will evaluate all articles.

AUTHORSHIP

Submissions must be the work of one person. Joint authorships will not be accepted. Submissions must be originally argued and researched legal papers. Consultation with professors and other professionals in the field is permitted, but the author must research and write the entire article. Entries cannot be more than 30 double spaced pages in length. Articles must be in 12 point font with one inch margins. Authors must conform to the relevant McGill Guide legal citation format.

AWARD

- \$1000 cash prize courtesy of LEAP and the Law Foundation of Ontario
- Publication of the article in the LEAP 2011 Conference book
- Letter to the Dean of the student's law school
